Recent acquisitions include 86 new books in the last year, covering a broad range of disciplines such as English literature, pure sciences, arts, history, social sciences, and languages. The reading area accommodates 556 users, creating a conducive environment for study and research.

The library is automated using the Integrated Library Management System (ILMS), featuring software like N-LIST (version 2.0, implemented in 2023) and Hammer (version 2.2.21, implemented in 2017). An Open Access Catalogue ensures seamless access for students and staff. Facilities include a well-furnished reading room for 50 users, a dedicated reference section, and displays for new arrivals of books and journals. Security measures like CCTV surveillance and a visitor's log maintain resource integrity.

The library plays a pivotal role in fostering critical thinking, providing content for academic excellence, and supporting research competence essential for the modern age, making it a vital asset for the college community.

6.3.5 - Institutions Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non- teaching staff

The institution conducts an annual performance appraisal for all employees after completing one year of service. This system aims to objectively evaluate employee performance, identify areas for improvement, and foster professional growth.

Teaching Staff: The performance of faculty members is assessed using the Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) aligned with the UGC Career Advancement Scheme (CAS). Faculty submit a PBAS proforma detailing their API scores, which are verified by department heads and reviewed by senior management. Faculty with due promotions appear before a screening-cum-selection committee based on their API scores. Additional contributions beyond academics are recognized and factored into assessments. Student feedback collected at the end of each semester is analyzed by a departmental team to enhance the teaching-learning process.

Non-Teaching Staff: The non-teaching staff undergo annual assessment via confidential reports and performance appraisals. Evaluations cover 32 parameters, including discipline, reliability, technical abilities, and organizational skills. Grading is done on a multi-point scale, and overall performance is assessed by the reporting officer and forwarded to the director.

The appraisal system has been instrumental in motivating employees, highlighting strengths and areas for improvement, and ensuring overall performance enhancement, aligning individual growth with institutional goals.
